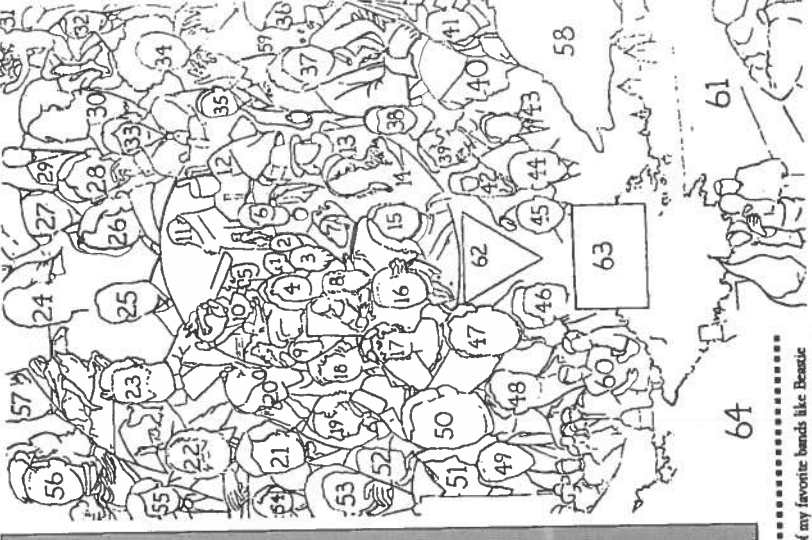

When I was young, I always played Atari games they were like Nintendo is

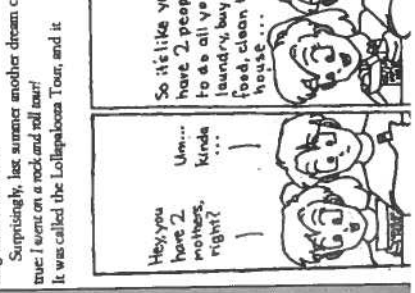
now. I heard about these game developers who hid in the mountains and designed games, and that sounded so amazing I thought, "I wish I could do that."

Surprisingly, last summer another dream came true: I went on a rock and roll tour!

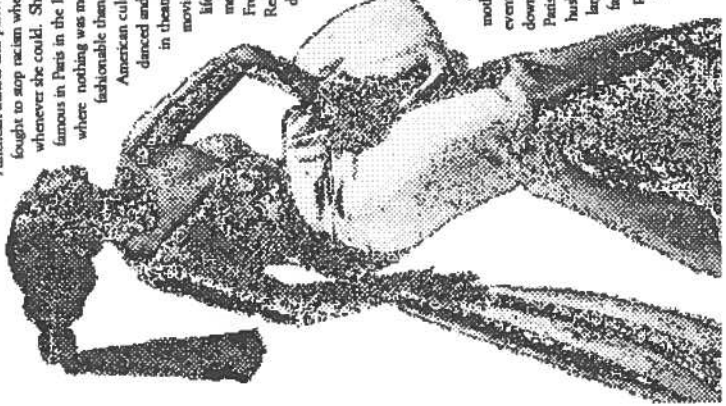
It was called the Lollapalooza Tour, and it



Josephine Baker: Star, Mother, Biennial

Born in the U.S.A. in 1906, Josephine Baker was a very talented African-American dancer and performer who fought to stop racism wherever and whenever she could. She became famous in Paris in the 1920's where nothing was more fashionable than African-American culture. She danced and performed in theatre and movies all her life, was a member of the French Resistance during World War Two, and founded and supported an orphanage.

A bisexual mother, she eventually settled down to live in Paris with her husband and large multiracial family, after performing all over the U.S. and Europe. She died in 1975. She

New Club for Kids with Gay Parents, Created by Kids with Gay Parents

The COLAGE Kids Club is the first and only organization for young kids with lesbian and gay parents, and it is created by daughters and sons of lesbian and gay parents.

"The most pressing problem facing kids with lesbian and gay parents is our isolation," says Suzanne Pullen, COLAGE's Administrative Assistant and herself the daughter of a lesbian mother. "It isn't about an adult world of politics, it's about a kids' world of connecting and making friends who understand. It exposes kids all over the world to a community they are a product and a part of, in a way that they can relate to."

The American Bar Association estimates there are upwards of 8 million daughters and sons of lesbian and gay parents in the U.S. alone, hundreds of thousands of whom are under 10. But despite these enormous numbers, books for kids with lesbian and gay parents, like *Daddy's Roommate* are one of the most censored genres, being pulled from the shelves of libraries all over the country by members of the religious right who don't understand that lesbian and gay people can make valid and loving families.

Instead of dwelling on other people's ignorance, the Club emphasizes the diversity of our family structures, racial backgrounds, economic levels and how kids came into the world in fun and engaging ways. This includes membership cards, t-shirts, birthday cards and the FunPages, a quarterly publication similar to the kids pages in the Sunday paper. The FunPages have lesbian and gay positive cartoons, games and member submissions.

COLAGE was created six years ago by children of lesbian and gay parents, focusing on the needs of teenagers. Over a year ago, a number of parents and younger kids approached COLAGE to ask for something for younger kids, out of which grew the COLAGE Kids Club. Building self-esteem early on is important and necessary for kids to connect with others and develop tools to deal with the ever present homophobia that children of gays and lesbians face.

COLAGE currently has over a thousand members and two dozen affiliated peer groups around the U.S., Canada, and Northern Europe.

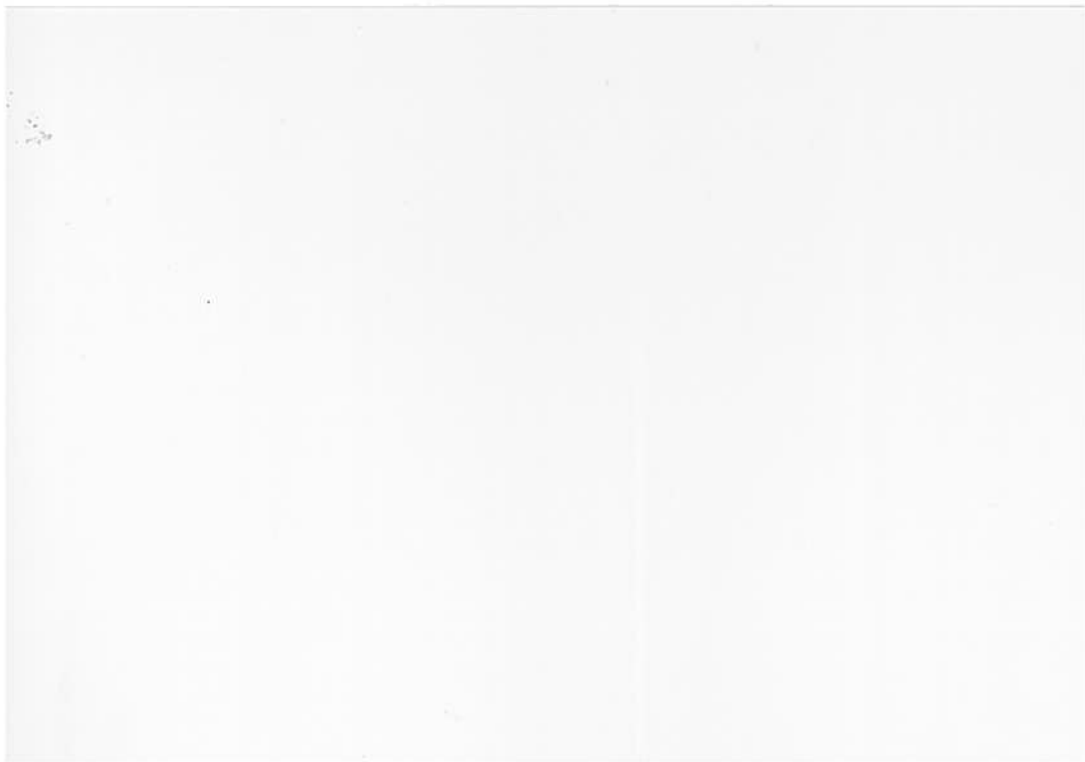

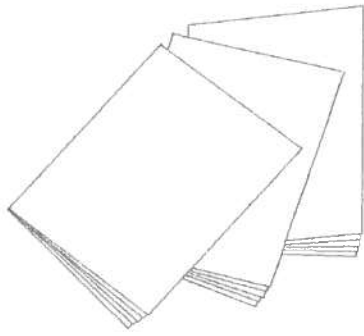

Please let me know how you would like to proceed. I think we can be of enormous help to one another!

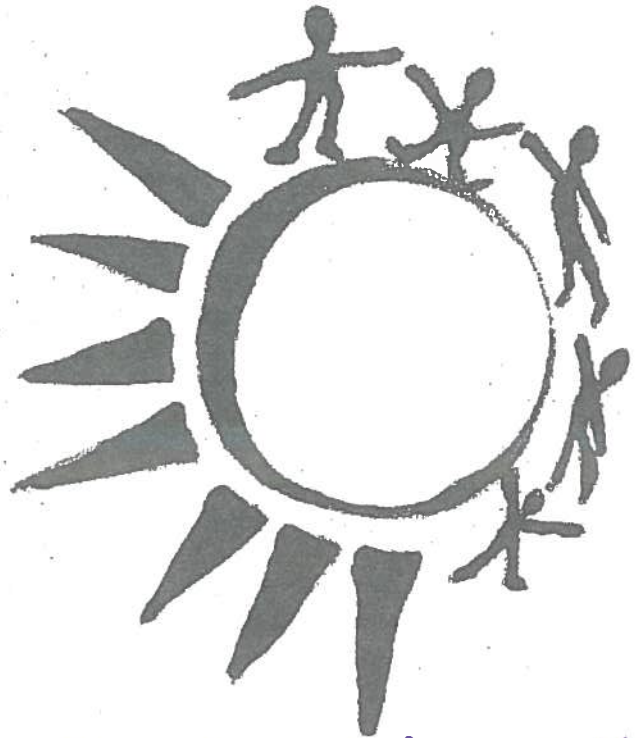

NEW GROUP FOR 2 - 5 YEAR OLDS

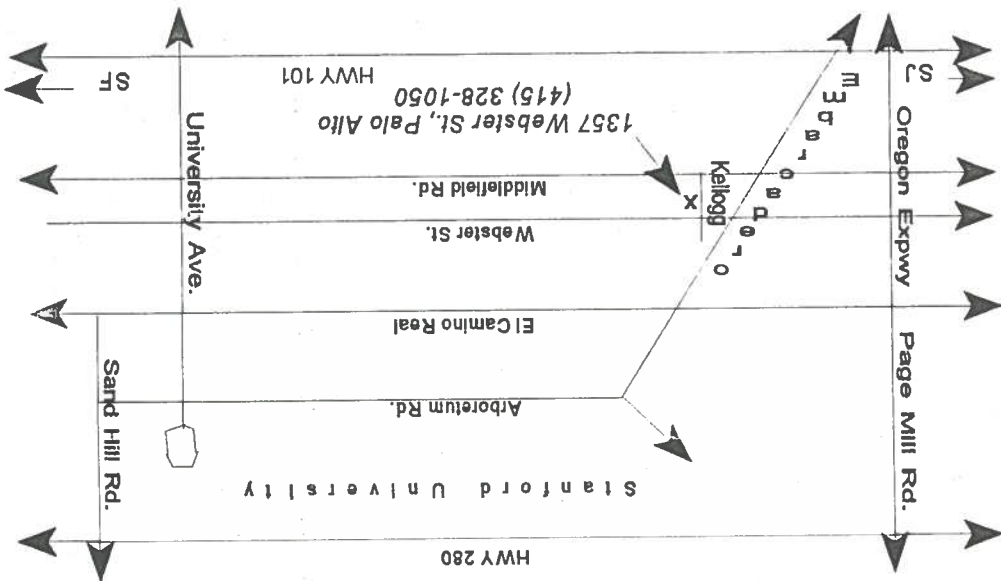
