PHYSIQUE PHOTOGRAPHY

Since so many of our members evince an interest in physique photography, perhaps it will not be amiss to air some of our views on the subject.

At its best, the art of photographing the human form represents an effort at sculpture. Not many are talented in this art made famous by the early Greeks, nor are many of us financially able to secure any appreciable number of the sculptor's handiwork. Likewise, in most cases, we are not gifted in drawing or painting the human figure. Therefore, we use the more practical and more economical medium of photography. This understanding is especially important in the constant aim to secure the third-dimensional effect.

It seems safe to say that the vast majority of artists and artistically minded people agree that the perfectly formed human body is the most beautiful physical thing on this earth. Perhaps we are egotistic in this conclusion. Possibly a horse considers another horse more beautiful than any man; but even this is a supposition, since we have no way of ascertaining a horse's artistic preferences. At any rate, artists, sculptors, physicians, biologists, and mechanical engineers will all agree that the human body is really quite a marvelous mechanism, especially when it is at its best. Its potentialities are almost unlimited. Accordingly, it is not surprising that the human structure has through the ages been an object of endless admiration as well as of scientific study.

With these two reasons why we find interest in "physique photography," let us examine just what we seek specifically as satisfactory results. Like any form of art, such photos should express, and perhaps emphasize the best possibilities of, the beauty inherent with the subject available.

While we fear that some devotees of physique photography are primarily interested in heavily muscled "strong men" who with pride exhibit the achievements of heavy bar-bell routines, we feel that they may be overlooking the more inspiring possibilities of capturing the beauty of the human figure.

First, as in portrait photography, the trick is to find that view of the face, just the right tilt of the head and expression of the eyes, degree of smile, etc., that (1) give the most attractive effect and (2) that are "in mood" with the position of the remainder of the body. "Muscleman pictures", with a blank stare on the model's face, are very unsatisfying.

Second, awkward, unbalanced, and unnatural positions usually give one the impression of artificiality, "over-posing" or the ridiculous. Naturalness, balance, and grace all have an irreplaceable charm in

themselves. Sometimes the model is asked to twist in a particular position in order to bring out his best lines, but always this should be kept within natural limitations.

Third, since we have mentioned "lines", let us add quickly that we have no ready-made set of rules to offer. Obviously, we don't seek either fat or "skinny" models. Just as in automobile body design people's tastes differ, but a study of classical sculpture will perhaps give some criteria. We feel head-and-shoulder outlines, both as viewed from the side and back are important, as are the lines represented by the torso, legs and arms.

Fourth, choice of a model is extremely important as to natural handsomeness, his willingness to cooperate, and that somewhat difficult-to-find ability to strike graceful positions instinctively.

Fifth, there are often attractive poses that require tenseness of muscles and facial expression to picture athletic feats, etc., that call for the opposite of repose. If the picture is intended to portray strength under strain, the entire body, including the facial expression, should reflect that condition as a matter of unity of effect.

Aside from these general thoughts in connection with this hobby, another appeals to us as important in the selection of a model. Should he be a youth in his teens or a mature, full-grown man? Our observation has been that physique photographers have decided individual preferences in this respect. In general, however, it is natural for boys and younger men to prefer models of fully mature stature—youth admires maturity. On the other hand, the "older generation" tends to admire youth and select models who reflect that which they have lost forever, the freshness, agility and grace of youth.

CAMP COMFORTS

Many people have become prejudiced against camping in the open with a tent and campfire because of the discomforts of trying to sleep on the "cold, hard ground" and of fighting mosquitoes all night. Any interest in the beauty and other attractions of outdoor life are outweighed by these two very real discomforts.

It is our experience that no one can really enjoy camp life unless this includes comfortable sleep at night. Thanks to modern ingenuity, these two camping problems have been solved. There is no longer any necessity for a civilian camper to sleep uncomfortably. The lightest piece of equipment to assure reasonable comfort is an air mattress, not quite fully inflated. In conjunction with the air mattress, a light cot may be added, if the extra duffel is not objectionable. Otherwise, there should be a canvas floor sewn into the tent itself and covered with a loose rubberized cloth as a waterproof foundation for the air mattress. This keeps ground dampness from the bed. To secure necessary warmth, as many blankets should be provided under as over

the sleeper, and all blankets sunned daily when the weather permits. Also, a pillow, ordinary or air-inflated, should be included. Most people prefer cotton blankets or sheets next to them, as woolen blankets are usually scratchy.

While some prefer a tent that has enough height to permit standing, this of course adds weight to the necessary equipment. More important is a tent that is relatively water-proof. No canvas is 100% water-proof but it can be treated so that it is quite water-repellent and altogether satisfactory in heavy rain, especially if the roof portions are sharply slanted. To avoid the nocturnal scourge of mosquitoes, the tent must be "bug-proof". Since a tent must of course have an entrance and yet provide ventilation, the easiest answer is a "bug-proof" door. This is accomplished by sewing mosquito-bar, or, better, marquisette curtains sewn to the tent front at the top and sides, with a full-length zipper opening in the "door" portion. The bottom of these curtains should be folded into the ground cloth edge or attached thereto.

In addition insecticides, generally available either in "bombs" or for use in spray guns, often are useful aids.

Aside from these protective measures against insects, the selection of the camp site is even more important. Campers should not locate their camps near marshes or stagnant water. It is always preferable, where permitted, to locate a camp that affords an open sweep of the prevailing wind. Mosquitoes, etc., avoid the wind. Often the most picturesque, sheltered nooks also shelter millions of nibbling insects.

As for camp cooking, much equipment is available in Army and sports stores. While the open fire affords more fun and romance, often a small gasoline stove (of course with added weight) offers advantages on rainy days, saves blackening of the utensils, and a life-saver in areas where open fires are prohibited.

Finally, be cautious of all fires, including cigarettes and matches on camp trips. Your enjoyment can so easily lead to catastrophe and death!

Nevertheless, camping can be altogether comfortable, healthful, and full of fun, but like any other activity of value, it should be planned so that you may enjoy the outdoors at its best.
