


Proclamation

This is the 28th Annual Convention of Tall Clubs International made up of 33 Clubs throughout the United States and Canada. The purpose of the Tall Clubs is to imbue its tall members, both men and women, with a sense of enduring pride in their height, to encourage them to participate in all civic endeavors and to inform the population at large of their special needs.

The Golden Gate Tip Toppers of San Francisco are to be the host Club at the convention for the third time in the 28 year history of the clubs. Beginning July 8 through July 14, 1974, a full week of activities will be sponsored. The highlight of the week's activities will be the Miss Tall International Pageant, Tuesday, July 9, which will commence with a cable car bus motorcade through the downtown area having aboard 17 Tall beauties representing various Clubs throughout the United States. A beauty pageant will be held at the Sheraton-Palace Hotel Gold Room at 8:30 p. m. to select the 1974-75 Miss Tall International representative. A grand ball will be held Saturday, July 13 in the Gold Room prior to which a special merit awards ceremony will be held to give outstanding members awards for their contributions to tall awareness.
