While other candidates are strategizing how to run for the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, Denise D'Anne is already fulfilling her platform promises to the people of San Francisco.

She has saved San Francisco taxpayers hundreds of thousands of dollars. How? She created and developed the Resource Conservation Program for the Department of Human Services, a program which makes full use of all departmental resources, that formerly were lost. The money Denise is saving could be used to fund those services that touch every San Franciscan: underfunded, critical services like healthcare, Muni, programs for parks and recreational facilities and more. "If we adopted my program throughout all 61 City departments, we would save millions of dollars, create meaningful jobs and stop the drain on our limited resources," says Denise.

Who is Denise D'Anne?



DENISE D'ANNE was born in Brooklyn, New York of a 15 year old mother from a poor Italian immigrant family. Raised in foster homes, she moved to California a week before her 21st birthday. Denise immediately involved herself in the local Catholic Youth Organization and began publishing a newsletter.

After she graduated from Los Angeles State University with a degree in political science, she moved to San Francisco where she joined the National Organization of Women and helped

write the Ordinance that established the Commission on the Status of Women. Denise then joined UNION WAGE (Union Women's Alliance to Gain Equality) and ran for president of her union. She also published and edited her union's newspaper.

Denise is the former president of San Francisco Community Recyclers and had a stint as a commentator on environmental issues on a local radio station where she was known as the Green Lady. She helped write the Sustainable Plan for the City of San Francisco.

Denise is a prolific writer and has established newsletters in all her city jobs, written many op-ed pieces for the San Francisco Examiner and her letters to the editor can be seen in all San Francisco newspapers, speaking out on local issues of community concern.

Denise is presently on the boards of San Francisco Tomorrow, Sustainable San Francisco, the Harvey Milk LGBT Democratic Club and MAGIK, a matchmaker between businesses and nonprofits providing materials and furniture. She is a delegate to the San Francisco Labor Council and is a longtime member of the Golden Gate Tip Toppers (a social club for tall women and men).

TENANTS/HOMEOWNERS

DENISE D'ANNE is a small home owner who was a tenant most of her life. She does not believe we should be forced to pay taxes on ill-conceived bond measures suddenly foisted on taxpayers without prior consent or study and that negatively impact both tenants and homeowners.



HER SOLUTION: Developing multi-year budgets that use a significant portion of the budget for infrastructure maintenance; prioritizing bond measures that serve the needs of all San Franciscans and developing alternative funding sources before we go to bonds.

CHILDREN



DENISE D'ANNE has spent volunteer time at Juvenile Hall. This experience has brought to light the need for more recreational facilities and after-school programs for children. These services are usually the last to be considered for funding. Part of the savings envisioned from Denise's Resource Conservation Program would be a good funding source for children's programs and facilities. Neglecting our children is a sure sign of a society in decay.

DENISE D'ANNE believes that many City employees like herself could come up with many solutions to our present problems if they were freed from the shackles of bureaucracy. She would issue an emancipation-from-bureaucracy proclamation for City employees, so that they too can exercise their creativity, initiative and problem solving abilities.

MUNI

DENISE D'ANNE is a Muni rider who has workable solutions to our failed transportation system.



HER SOLUTION: Providing dedicated bus lanes that go in the opposite direction of traffic; developing fare-free Muni in the core business district, funded by a Downtown Transit Assessment District; charging those City employees who currently enjoy free parking on city property, raising

Denise knows the frustration of riding Muni between \$5 to \$8 million a year; providing for secure bike lanes to help reduce auto congestion.

SENIORS



Our Seniors are the reservoir of our institutional memory, wisdom and knowledge. The most important gift we can give to our Seniors is a decent roof over their heads. We must preserve housing that Seniors can afford. Denise will work with the

Senior community to ensure they remain a part of the San Francisco they helped to create.

DENISE D'ANNE is a small business person, a tax accountant and former restaurateur who knows how hard it is for small businesses to survive. Small businesses provide the bulk of San Francisco's employment, but are burdened with high taxes, high rent and unnecessarily onerous government regulations. Installing a comprehensive program for small businesses, streamlining and eliminating some government regulations, giving tax credits to small business that hire local citizens, placing a moratorium on chain store proliferation by restricting such stores' square footage, and providing for low interest loans.

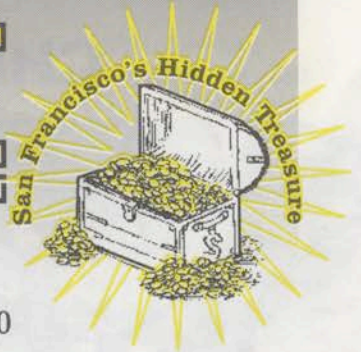
